2. First level heading
 - 2.1. Second level heading
 - 2.1.1 Third level heading

Tables

- The tables should be numbered in sequence in accordance to the order of appearance in the article.
- The tables should be referenced in the text. e.g.:
Improving walking and cycling conditions provides enjoyment and health benefits to users, and helps support related retail, recreation and tourism industries (Table 1).
- The title of the table should be concise, no more than one sentence. The title should be in front of the table.
- Any footnotes should be placed below the table.

Table 1 Consumer Expenditure by Mode

| Mode | Weekly Expenditures |
|------------------------|---------------------|
| Bus | £63 |
| Car | £64 |
| On foot | £91 |
| Train/tube | £46 |
| Other (taxi, cycle...) | £56 |

Images

- The images should be numbered in sequence in accordance to the order of appearance in the article.
- The images should be referenced in the text. e.g.:
Our study compared sixteen outdoor play spaces at child care centre with children aged two to five (Fig. 1).
- Measurement is not smaller than **12cm × 18cm, >300dpi**.
- Every image should be accompanied with a caption or a brief description, and copyright owner/photographer.

- The references should be numbered in sequence in accordance to the order of appearance in the article.

- The references should be referenced in the text. e.g.:

Over half the children up to age 5 in Canada are enrolled in some form of child care^[3].

- Wherever possible, APA reference system should be used. e.g.

Author, A. A., Author, B. B. (year). Title of article. Title of Periodical, XX, pp-pp.

Author, A. A. (year). Title of work. Location: publisher.

Notes

- Where reference system is inappropriate, an end notes system may be used, with citations identified in text by consecutively numbered superscripts. End notes should be used sparingly and be brief.

- The notes should be referenced in the text. e.g.:

The jurisdictional boundary wall sits between the new campus of Jimei University[®].

- Make the notes after the main text body. e.g.:

③ Jimei University, one of the key universities in Fujian Province, is a multi-disciplined university with students from all over the country.
